
# Freshman Summer Start Program

### Overview

#### **Course Enrollment Process**


- Accepted students are emailed course enrollment information and a custom course enrollment form link.
- Students should review the FSSP Schedule of Classes and submit their course enrollment form as soon as possible.
- Student Services Advisors will enroll students into courses based on their preferences.
- Students will receive an email once their schedule is ready to be viewed.
- Students will have the ability to adjust their FSSP schedules as of July 30<sup>th</sup>, prior to the start of the program.




### **Course Enrollment Form**

### **Helpful Hints**

- Select 6 unique course preferences!
- Be mindful of how many total units you'd like to enroll in when filling out the form.
- If you select a Writing OR a Math course, please send your official test scores to UCSB (they must be sent directly from the testing agency).
- Submit your course enrollment form as soon as possible – course enrollment occurs on a firstcome first-served basis, and space is limited in some courses.
- Keep an eye on your UCSB email for communication from the Student Services Team.

### **Building Your Schedule**

- FSSP students enroll in 7-14 units.
- Use FSSP as an opportunity to get a head start on general education or major requirements, or to explore an entirely new area of interest!
- All courses taken during FSSP will appear on your official UCSB transcript.
- We encourage FSSP students to consider enrolling in at least one Freshman Seminar during the program.



## Reading the Schedule of Classes

#### Information to Note

- GE Areas listed on the FSSP Schedule of Classes are only applicable to students in the College of Letters & Science.
- Pay close attention to courses that have a symbol next to them. That indicates they have a discussion section in addition to a lecture times listed.
- Some courses will meet synchronously this summer, and others will meet asynchronously.

#### EARTH W 20 - GEOLOGICAL CATASTROPHIES .

DAYS: ASYNCHRONOUS

TIME: ASYNCHRONOUS

Course deals with geologic catastrophes, e.g., earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, tsunamis, and landslides. Students will learn the basic physical causes of these naturally occurring events and discuss the consequences.



## Math and Writing Courses

#### **Eligibility**

- Students are not guaranteed placement in a math or writing course during FSSP.
- Advising Staff will enroll students in the appropriate math OR writing course when official test scores are available.
- Official test scores must be sent directly to UCSB from the testing agency.
- Students may receive a preliminary FSSP course schedule prior to being enrolled in a math or writing course.

## Advising at UCSB

- Campus resources are available to students in all three colleges!




#### **Degree Requirements**

- You will learn more about University, General Education, & Special Subject Requirements at Freshman Orientation. These can also be referenced on Page 4 of the FSSP Schedule of Classes.
- FSSP course offerings are broken down by requirement area (for L&S only) on page 6 of the FSSP Schedule of Classes.
- Some courses in the FSSP Schedule of Classes don't satisfy any specific requirement. That's okay! They will apply to the unit total needed to graduate.
- We encourage you to diversify your FSSP schedule as much as possible!
  - (Ex: Try not to take 3 writing courses at once.)



#### **Pre-Majors & Grading**

- Some majors have a pre-major step that requires completion of certain courses with a specific GPA.
- Grades earned in pre-major courses completed at a non-UC institution are not used in the pre-major GPA calculation.
- Courses for your pre-major and/or major need to be taken for a letter grade.
- UCSB uses a grading system that includes pluses and minuses.
  - B = 3.0 GPA
  - B- = 2.7 GPA



#### **Duplicate Matriculation**

- You cannot receive credit for courses that you have already completed. This includes AP/IB, community college, other universities, and UCSB coursework.
- Ex: You can receive credit for only one lower division statistics course whether offered by Math, Statistics, Psychology, Communication, etc.
- Check ASSIST.org for CA community college transfer equivalents, and the General Catalog and LASAR for AP/IB equivalents.
- If you have questions about duplicate matriculation, please contact an advisor in your college!



#### **Deadlines**

- UCSB has strict deadlines for making changes to your schedule (add, drop, grading option).
- All course information is available on GOLD.
- Deadlines come quickly. If a deadline is approaching and you are considering making changes, or if you missed a deadline, see an advisor immediately.
- Requests for exceptions are not automatically granted.



The Online Freshman Orientation program will take place during the following two-day remote sessions. All session dates are subject to availability.


The orientation <u>reservation system</u> will open in mid-May.

### **Schedule Change Request Form**

- If you would like to make a change to your course preferences and/or schedule, you will need to submit an online schedule change request form on our website.

- As of June 30<sup>th</sup> the Student Services Team will review these requests and accommodate them as space and time allow.
- If we are unable to accommodate your request prior to the start of the program, you will be able to adjust your own schedule as of July 30<sup>th</sup>.
